JANE LOBENSTEIN-BOLLER, (PHS 1982)

Jane Lobenstein-Boller graduated from Portage High School in 1982 as one of the school's most successful athletes ever. During her high school career, Ms. Lobenstein-Boller earned 11 letters in volleyball, basketball and track and field. As a member of the girls' volleyball team, Ms. Lobenstein-Boller was named as a 1st team all-state volleyball player while leading the Portage volleyball team to a WIAA state championship in 1981. Ms. Lobenstein-Boller also led the 1982 girls' basketball team to a WIAA state championship. During her basketball career, she accumulated individual honors such as the Milwaukee Journal Player of the Year award in 1981 and 1982, the Wisconsin State Journal's All-Area Girls' Player of the Year award in 1981 and 1982 and first team all-conference awards in her sophomore, junior and senior seasons. During her three years on the Portage varsity basketball team, the Warriors were 96-2. Ms. Lobenstein-Boller was named the first ever Miss Basketball in Wisconsin following her senior season and was inducted into the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2012. Ms. Lobenstein-Boller went on to a very successful four-year career at Iowa State University where, at the time of her induction into the Portage HOF, she ranked as second all-time in career steals and eighth all-time in career assists. She was a four year letter winner, earned first team All-Big 8 honors and was named the team's Most Outstanding Player in 1986 and was presented Iowa State's Female Athlete of the Year Award, also in 1986. Ms. Lobenstein-Boller currently resides in Iowa.
