Maurice Goodman graduated from Portage High School in 1946 and worked his way up in the Hollywood ranks to eventually become a top executive at networks NBC and FOX. Mr. Goodman used his skills as a writer to sell short stories and scripts to the networks for over seven years. He earned an Emmy nomination as a writer for an episode entitled "Two Hundred Large" for the television series *Ironside* aired in 1974. Mr. Goodman then took a position as editor for NBC-TV's Broadcast Standards in 1973 and eventually was promoted to network vice-president in 1981, a position which essentially determined which shows were aired and which shows were not. Shortly after leaving NBC in 1989, Mr. Goodman continued to write television scripts and then took a position in the broadcast standards division at FOX network. Mr. Goodman is currently retired and lives in the Los Angeles area.
